# REFEREE



**ROLE DESCRIPTION** 

To become a CYBATHLON referee, no foreknowledge is required, CYBATHLON will train you for this role. Your responsibility as a referee is to guarantee the pilots' compliance to the competition rules during the races.

### This includes:

- Control of correct track set-up according to the definitions in the rulebook prior to the competition and races.
- **▼** On-track refereeing during the races of individual pilots
- Communication with the scorer and the teams

Since CYBATHLON is a competition with rules that are unique and detailed, you should:

- Have an eye for details
- Be able to take fast decisions
- Study the <u>CYBATHLON rulebook</u> prior to the competition
- Not have an affiliation with any team
- As a plus: have experience in refereeing from other sports or competitions

You will be responsible for one discipline at your local hub and we will instruct you via online meetings in advance to the competition. Local travel expenses can be reimbursed.

# MANUAL SCORER

#### **ROLE DESCRIPTION**



To become a CYBATHLON manual scorer, no foreknowledge is required, CYBATHLON will train you for this role. Your responsibility as a manual scorer is the recording of the results and task time in a manual manner during the competitions to ensure fair scoring regardless of any connectivity issues.



The manual scorer also acts as deputy to the scorer in case of absence.

### This includes:

- Entering the results / decisions and time-keeping during the race according to the referee's ruling on a score sheet
- **▼** Collaboration with the referee, scorer and the teams
- Deputy to the scorer in case of absence

Since CYBATHLON is a competition with rules that are unique and detailed, you should:

- Have an eye for details
- Be able to take fast decisions
- Study the <u>CYBATHLON rulebook</u> prior to the competition
- Not have an affiliation with any team
- As a plus: have experience in refereeing from other sports or competitions
